

A County-by-County look at Girl Scouting in Vermont

Addison County

Addison County is home to 396 girl members in grades K-12 and 88 adult members. Last year, 222 girls from Addison County participated in special outreach programs in arts, math, science, and sports. 124 Girls enjoyed Day Camp in Addison County and 50 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Last year, 75 women from Addison County participated in training experiences ranging from Basic Leader Training to CPR and First Aid and from Training for Outdoor Adventures to How to Prepare Girls for the Annual Cookie Program. Girl Scouting's two highest recognitions, the Silver and Gold Awards, incorporate strong service components into their criteria. Recently, 8 girls from Addison County have attained these honors.

Bennington County

Bennington County is home to 268 girl members in grades K-12 and 53 adult members. Four members of the Board of Directors are from Bennington County, including one of three teen members. Last year, 114 girls from Bennington County participated in special outreach programs in arts, math, science, and sports. 125 Girls enjoyed the Jump-In Day Camp in Bennington County and 15 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Last year, 65 women from Bennington County participated in training experiences ranging from Basic Leader Training to CPR and First Aid and from Training for Outdoor Adventures to How to Prepare Girls for the Annual Cookie Program. Girl Scouting's two highest recognitions, the Silver and Gold Awards, incorporate strong service components into their criteria. Recently, 10 girls from Bennington County have attained these honors.

Caledonia County

Caledonia County is home to 240 girl members in grades K-12 and 40 adult members. Two members of the Board of Directors are from Caledonia County. Chittenden County

Essex County

Essex County is home to 65 girl members in grades K-12 and 11 adult members. Franklin County

Franklin County is home to 434 girl members in grades K-12 and 87 adult members. One member of the Board of Directors is from Franklin County. Girls with incarcerated Moms also participated in Girl Scouts Beyond Bars. 112 girls enjoyed Day Camp in Franklin County and 84 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Last year, 75 women from Franklin County participated in training experiences ranging from Basic Leader Training to CPR and First Aid and from Training for Outdoor Adventures to How to Prepare Girls for the Annual Cookie Program. Girl Scouting's two highest recognitions, the Silver and Gold Awards, incorporate strong service components into their criteria. Recently, 6 girls from Franklin County have attained these honors.

Grand Isle County

Grand Isle County is home to 81 girl members in grades K-12 and 14 adult members. Last year, 45 girls from Grand Isle County participated in special outreach programs in arts, math, science, and sports. 22 girls enjoyed Day Camp in Grand Isle County and 9 girls attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Lamoille County

Lamoille County is home to 233 girl members in grades K-12 and 44 adult members. Two members of the Board of Directors are from Lamoille County. Girls with incarcerated Moms also participated in Girl Scouts Beyond Bars. 97 girls enjoyed Day Camp in Lamoille County and 45 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Last year, 43 women from Lamoille County participated in training experiences ranging from Basic Leader Training to CPR and First Aid and from Training for Outdoor Adventures to How to Prepare Girls for the Annual Cookie Program. Girl Scouting's two highest recognitions, the Silver and Gold Awards, incorporate strong service components into their criteria. Recently, 2 girls from Lamoille County have attained these honors.

Orange County

Orange County is home to 143 girl members in grades K-12 and 20 adult members. Last year, 98 girls from Orange County participated in special outreach programs in arts, math, science, and sports. Girls with incarcerated Moms also participated in Girl Scouts Beyond Bars. 7 girls enjoyed Day Camp in Orange County and 23 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Orleans County

Orleans County is home to 251 girl members in grades K-12 and 49 adult members. One member of the Board of Directors is from Orleans County. Last year, 95 girls from Orleans County participated in special outreach programs in arts, math, science, and sports. Girls with incarcerated Moms also participated in Girl Scouts Beyond Bars. 75 girls enjoyed Day Camp in Orleans County and 9 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Last year, 42 women from Orleans County participated in training experiences ranging from Basic Leader Training to CPR and First Aid and from Training for Outdoor Adventures to How to Prepare Girls for the Annual Cookie Program. Girl Scouting's two highest recognitions, the Silver and Gold Awards, incorporate strong service components into their criteria. Recently, 2 girls from Orleans County have attained these honors.

Rutland County

Rutland County is home to 658 girl members in grades K-12 and 155 adult members. One member of the Board of Directors is from Rutland County. Last year, 150 girls from Rutland County participated in special outreach programs in arts, math, science, and sports. Numerous girls with incarcerated Moms from Rutland County also participated in Girl Scouts Beyond Bars. 107 girls enjoyed Day Camp in Rutland County and 80 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Last year, 103 women from Rutland County participated in training experiences ranging from Basic Leader Training to CPR and First Aid and from Training for Outdoor Adventures to How to Prepare Girls for the Annual Cookie Program. Girl Scouting's two highest recognitions, the Silver and Gold Awards, incorporate strong service components into their criteria. Recently, 2 girls from Rutland County have attained these honors.

Washington County

Washington County is home to 502 girl members in grades K-12 and 101 adult members. Five members of the Board of Directors are from Washington County. Last year, 131 girls from Washington County participated in special outreach programs in arts, math, science, and sports. Girls with incarcerated Moms also participated in Girl Scouts Beyond Bars. 78 Girls enjoyed Day Camp in Washington County and 75 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. Last year, 95 women from Washington County participated in training experiences ranging from Basic Leader Training to CPR and First Aid and from Training for Outdoor Adventures to How to Prepare Girls for the Annual Cookie Program. Girl Scouting's two highest recognitions, the Silver and Gold Awards, incorporate strong service components into their criteria. Recently, 5 girls from Washington County have attained these honors.

Windham County

Windham County is home to many girl and adult members. Most of those are part of Girl Scouts of Swift Water Council. However, through the Girl Scout Council of Vermont, several girls and adults are served through the Girl Scouts Beyond Bars program. 37 girls and 8 adults are members through this program. Girls with incarcerated Moms attend a program at the Windsor facility every three weeks. Volunteer drivers transport girls from their homes in Windham County to the Southeast facility. There, they enjoy all kinds of activities that are typical of Girl Scout program. They have been snow shoeing, gone on hikes, tried cooking over an open fire, completed service projects, carved pumpkins, tried new sports, and enjoyed quality time with their Moms, all through Girl Scouts Beyond Bars. Last year, 10 women from Windham County participated in Basic Leader Training at the Southeast Correctional Facility, so they could participate in this program. Other girls attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki.

Windsor County

Windsor County is home to 157 girl and 21 adult members. Windsor County is unique for us in that some girls are part of the Girl Scout Council of Vermont while others are served through Girl Scouts of Swift Water Council. Last year, many girls from Windsor County participated in special outreach programs in arts, math, science, and sports. 31 girls enjoyed Day Camp in Springfield and 3 attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki. In addition, several girls and adults are served through the Girl Scouts Beyond Bars program. 36 girls and 27 adults are members through this program. Girls with incarcerated Moms attend a program at the Windsor facility every three weeks. Volunteer drivers transport girls from their homes in Windsor County to the Southeast facility. There, they enjoy all kinds of activities that are typical of Girl Scout program. They have been snow shoeing, gone on hikes, tried cooking over an open fire, completed service projects, carved pumpkins, tried new sports, and enjoyed quality time with their Moms, all through Girl Scouts Beyond Bars. Last year, 6 women from Windsor County participated in Basic Leader Training at the Southeast Correctional Facility, so they could participate in this program. Other girls attended our resident camp, Camp Wapanacki.
